I approached the presidency as another wonderful Brandeis learning opportunity, as it has proved indeed. One extremely valuable lesson learned is how important it is to

ensure, as a Chapter leader, that each and every one of our activities and communications reinforces our critical mission: to provide philanthropic support for Brandeis University. Every BNC Phoenix Chapter activity you and I participate in, from book groups to luncheons to Book and Author 2016 events, provides the funds needed for scholarships, scientific research, the libraries' scholarly journals, and much, much more. #### **Ed Tarkington**



Nashville high school English teacher, class sponsor, literary magazine sponsor and wresting coach at Montgomery Bell Academy (MBA) Ed Tarkington says the memory of "Cousin Booth's success left my father under the delusion that writing was a practical career choice. So I was never properly discouraged."

Each morning during the school year, he rises at 3:30 a.m. and is at his desk by 4, where he writes fiction until it's time to leave for work at 7. The other 21 hours of the day belong to his wife,

two young daughters, and the boys at MBA. He has followed this routine for years, hoping that in an economic climate that's hostile to the authors of literary fiction that he would one day be rewarded for his efforts. Two weeks before his 40th birthday, Tarkington got the email he'd been awaiting for so long: his agent wrote to say that an editor at Algonquin Books wanted to talk with him.

The result of that conversation is that his debut novel, Only Love Can Break Your Heart, was published by Algonquin Books in January, 2016. It was an ABA Indies Introduce Pick for Winter/Spring 2016, and was chosen as a February Book of the Month Club selection.

Ed Tarkington received a BA from Furman University, an MA from the University of Virginia, and a PhD from the Graduate Creative Writing Program at Florida State. He is a frequent contributor to Chapter16.org, a Humanities Tennessee online publication, and his articles, essays, and stories have appeared in Nashville Scene, Memphis Commercial Appeal, Post Road, Pittsburgh Quarterly, the Southeast Review and elsewhere. A native of Lynchburg in Central Virginia, he now resides in Nashville, Tennessee.

#### Barbara A. Shapiro



Barbara A. Shapiro is the author of seven novels: The Muralist, The Art Forger, The Safe Room, Blind Spot, See No Evil, Blameless and Shattered Echoes; four screenplays: Blind Spot, The Lost Coven, Borderline and Shattered Echoes; and the non-fiction book, The Big Squeeze. In

her previous career incarnations, she directed research projects for a residential substance abuse facility, worked as a systems analyst/statistician, headed the Boston office of a software development firm and served as an adjunct professor teaching sociology at Tufts University and creative writing at Northeastern University. She likes being a novelist the best. She began her writing career when she quit a high-pressure job after the birth of her second child. Nervous about what to do next, she said to her mother, "If I'm not playing at being superwoman anymore, I don't know who I am." Her mother answered with the question: "If you had one year to live, how would you want to spend it?" The answer: write a novel and spend more time with her children. And that's exactly what she did. Smart mother.

After writing seven novels and raising her children, B.A. Shapiro now lives in Boston with her husband Dan and dog Sagan. She is currently working on yet another novel but has no plans to raise any more children.



#### Sean McLaughlin

A nine-time Emmy award winner, veteran Valley journalist Sean McLaughlin serves as the main weeknight news anchor for CBS 5 News.



McLaughlin joined the CBS 5 News

team in 2006. Prior to his return to the Valley, he served as MSNBC's weekday main meteorologist and Sunday weather anchor on NBC's Weekend Today with Lester Holt and Campbell Brown. He frequently Joined Matt, Katie and Ann on the weekday Today show, filling in for Al Roker.

During his network stint, McLaughlin reported for all

broadcast platforms for NBC Universal and was an integral part of the network's coverage of the record-breaking hurricane seasons of 2004 and 2005, including broadcasting live for nearly 16 hours straight as Hurricane Katrina approached the Gulf coastline.

Other broadcast highlights include live network coverage of the president's inauguration, multiple space shuttle launches, Winter & Summer Olympic Games, the Daytona 500 and multiple Super Bowls. After being named "Outstanding Young Alum" at Iowa State University, he now currently serves on the advisory board for the Greenlee School of Journalism at ISU.

He currently maintains his National Weather Association's Broadcast Seal of Approval and filled in on *The Early Show* for CBS in New York for over six years.

McLaughlin is married with four children and enjoys exploring Arizona with his family.






## Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg visited Brandeis University to honor Louis Brandeis



On Thursday, January 28 - a hundred years to the day that Brandeis University's namesake Louis D. Brandeis was nominated to the nation's highest court -Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg spoke to more than 2,500 gathered at Brandeis about his legacy and continued influence on public discourse and American jurisprudence.

Ginsburg, who has served on the Supreme Court since 1993, Brandeis for his praised commitment to civil rights and liberties, his willingness to change with the times, and his fact-based approach to writing legal briefs, visited Brandeis University to honor our namesake, whom Ginsburg said she emulates. Interim President Lisa Lynch, in her introduction of Ginsburg, pointed out some of the similarities between Brandeis, the first Jewish Supreme Court justice, and Ginsburg, the first female Jewish justice: Both have relied on fact-based jurisprudence to advance social change, and both have used their opinions and dissents to educate the public about the social conditions that affect people's lives.

But there are also differences between the two, Lynch noted. Ginsburg had to overcome gender-based discrimination to practice law, starting in law school and continuing in the law firms where she sought employment. Yet Ginsburg did not allow this adversity to block her path, which ultimately led to the Supreme Court. "She is a force of nature,"



Lynch said. "Underestimate her at your peril."

In her remarks at the centennial celebration, Ginsburg spoke about the famed "Brandeis brief," a legal-writing technique Brandeis pioneered as an attorney, in which he cited science- and social science-based data at length in his briefs.

Ginsburg said the method is one she admires and has emulated.

But, she said, when you look back at the original Brandeis brief, written for the Supreme Court case *Muller v. Oregon*, much of the scientific information it presented wouldn't hold up today.

The *Muller* case questioned whether the state of Oregon could impose a 10-hour-per-day work limit on women's employment. Brandeis' brief argued in favor of the limit. Yet the social and scientific observations it cited were based in reinforcing the notion of women as caretakers and as physically inferior to men.

"Would Brandeis' technique work when social and economic data are inconsistent, and used to challenge sex-based classifications in the law?" Ginsburg asked.

She also weighed in on how she thought Brandeis would view some of the court's more recent landmark decisions. Ginsburg said she had "no doubt" Brandeis would have agreed with the court's decision to uphold key pieces of the Affordable Care Act, and that he "would have deplored" the Citizens United ruling, which prohibited the government from restricting political-campaign spending by organizations, including for-profit corporations.
