

By Laws of the

Apostolic Faith Bible College

Article VII-Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians) and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- *Triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit
- *Creation and Formation
- *Man is basically sinful and in need of salvation
- *Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.
- *Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body, a Second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ
- *Baptism of the Holy Spirit, evidenced by the speaking in other languages
- *Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit
- *Sacrament of the Lord's Supper
- *Washing of Feet
- *Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers
- *Do not condone divorce and remarriage
- *Destruction of the Wicked
- *Conditional Immortality
- *Rapture of the Man child Class
- *Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly
- *A ministry supported by tithes and offerings

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above basic doctrines.

I Found It!

Ever since my wife Lavonda took her departure to heaven, I have been looking for it. I have looked everywhere. I went through all the dresser drawers, looked in all the closets, examined every jacket or coat pocket that she had worn. I had asked the Lord in prayer, almost every night, to help me find it and have even thought if I could just talk to Lavonda I know she could help me locate it.

It was not extravagant expensive, but it had been costly. We had looked at it together and Lavonda had decided she would like to have it so the decision was made

to purchase it. The last time I saw it Lavonda had been wearing it and now the days had turned to months and almost three years have gone by, and I still could not find it. I continued to search, search, and search. As I thought about it, I wondered could we have left it at the store? We had gone back to have it examined and had asked questions about it's size and value— do you suppose Lavonda had gone back again without me knowing? Had Lavonda taken it off and put it up in some secret place that only she knew about? Had the woman that had come from Hospice to help us that last day taken it? I had gone out of the room and she had been all alone, she would have had time.... Surely not. Each day brought more questions, but no answers. I continued to ask the Lord to please help mr find it.

Then I Found IT! When I did it was like "it" found me. I was getting ready to go to Camp Meeting this past summer at Laverne, Ok. Since I now travel alone I usually take a smaller suitcase. I was planning on not only going to Camp Meeting, but from there go on to Colorado. So I decided to take the larger suitcase that we had taken on our trips. As I was preparing to pack my clothes in the larger suitcase, I felt something in one of the small pockets along the edge of the suitcase, pulled it out and there to my great delight was what I had been looking for all these months. Wrapped carefully in a small, light blue, string tied cloth case, I found Lavonda's beautiful ring. I usually would put the suitcases up when we came back from a trip and I regularly checked to see if we got everything out, but I had failed to get the ring out. It was me— not Lavonda that had forgotten the ring! To me it was like I had discovered the *Pearl of Great Price!*

And that I believe is what Jesus meant when He told this Parable of the Kingdom about a merchant "seeking goodly pearls," and "when he found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had, and bought it" (Matthew 13:45-46 KJV) If necessary, I would have done just about anything to find Lavonda's ring. Why? Two very important reasons: (1) Because of the owner of the ring (Lavonda). (2) Because of the value of the ring.

Matthew refers to the Kingdom of God as the Kingdom of Heaven. They are not two separate subjects but one and the same. The use of 'kingdom of heaven' in Matthew is certainly due to the tendency in Judiasm to avoid the direct use of the name of God (New Bible Dictionary).

Nevertheless, the kingdom of heaven is more important in our lives than anything with which we may compare. It is more important because of whose it is; **God's.** It is more important because of it's value; **It cost the life of Jesus.** Who wouldn't in their right mind not sell everything that he or she thinks they possess and give it all you have to be a part of the Kingdom of Heaven? Tragically, "His Own" rejected their King and His Kingdom, but grace appeared and the Church "found it." "The kingdom of God shall be taken from you, and given a nation bringing forth the fruits thereof. "(Matthew 21:43) Since the establishment of the Church here on earth, Jesus has invited all who will be a part of producing Kingdom fruit.

Paul declares,: "the kingdom of God is not meat and drink; but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Ghost" (Romans 14:17). KJV In other words, these are some of the "fruit" that comes from being in the kingdom and having the "King" of the kingdom ruling in your life. Soon, hopefully, the Lord will begin the establishment of His literal Kingdom here on earth. When that happens "the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea" (Isaiah 11:9) KJV. I can only imagine the joy— a joy that begins with searching for and finding the Pearl of Great Price. Even more joy than I experienced when I found Lavonda's ring.




