Report of Elmer E. Campbell

After inspecting the situation at Manhogan Island
 the following recommendations are made for taking
 care of sewage and protecting the water supply at
 Manhogan. A complete sewer system should be in-
 stalled around the existing basin from which the
 water system is derived. A separate sewer line
 should be constructed on each side of the basin and
 all existing cottages be required to connect
 to the same, and cesspools and septic tanks be abandoned.
 These sewer lines can probably be brought together and
 discharge at a common point into the salt water.
 But before the discharge a septic tank should be installed
 just above high water to purify the sewage and remove
 or prevent offensive conditions being created at the
 beach. The overflow from the septic tank should be
 extended below tide mark. As a practical means of
 starting to make plans for this future development,
 we suggest that a special town meeting be called
 and the citizens vote to raise a small sum of money
 such as \$400. or \$500. to make a complete engineering
 survey of this proposed system and estimates of the
 probable cost be prepared. These arrangements may
 be made at the regular town meeting for early
 construction of the system.

Following is a record of the Special Plantation Meeting, held by the legal voters of Montezuma Plm on the 28th day of September 1931 in reconsideration of the vote taken to raise the sum of \$500. at a meeting held on July 14th 1931 for a survey of a sewer system.

First, Linwood A. Davis was chosen and qualified to preside as Moderator.

Second, Sewer System discussed

It was voted to reconsider the vote taken as above to raise the sum of \$500. for survey of Sewer System

Third, The record to action of draining and cleaning the meadow and adjacent land near water supply. This was also discussed, and during the discussion the question arose as to whether the Plantation had authority to do this work without consent of the land owners.

It was voted to give the Assessors authority to see if the land owners from which the present water supply comes will agree to have the meadow properly ditched and drained to a point at the present outlet, and to see if the Water Co. will help and to what extent financially in conjunction with the plantation in so doing, and to sink the present outlet at least one (1) foot to the sea.

It was also voted to raise the sum of \$500. in anticipation of such agreement for labor or same. The Assessors to make a report to a Special meeting to be called at a later date.


