

## Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

One of the lovely things about CGS is how the whole



parish can participate in the creation of the materials for the atrium. Per Maria Montessori's method there are hand made physical materials for the children to continue listening to God by moving the wooden figures around corresponding dioramas or copying Scripture or setting up a model of the altar to learn the names of the objects used at the Eucharist. We have most of these materials already; however, some need repair or replacing. What I need right now are people with nice handwriting/printing to make new prayer cards and covers for Scripture booklets. We don't use

computer-generated print because it doesn't carry the faith life of the person or community. Also I need someone who can sand and repaint a small table. Later I will need people who can create lifelike clay figures for the Last Supper. Let Pam Moore know if you or someone you know can help in any of these capacities.

We are still waiting for final \$ reports but it appears we raised just under \$13K in commissions and bonuses for the 8 games that we worked! And....we are not done! Based on the Brewers currently leading their division (by 9 games with only 31 games left to play), I fully expect we will be working playoff games (required per our contract). I also believe we earn a higher commission (10% vs. 6%) at post season games!

So, rest up and stay tuned for future communication regarding playoff games that start in early October.

# News from Fort Dauphin and the Friends of Toliara

From what I hear, the Youth Camp that was held last week in Fort Dauphin was a big success. Kids 13 and up were encouraged to go and approximately 250 of them did attend. Many of our sponsors, whose kids were eligible, sponsored their kids to go. For our kids, it was an easy deal since they live in or around Fort Dauphin so the rigors of travel did not affect them. The youth from Morondavo and Mahabo traveled 4 days each

way and those from Tsiharoa (our government school) walked 15 miles each way. And, the youth from Maroaloka walked around 53 miles each way bringing cattle, probably Zebu, to sell in Fort Dauphin. Heading off to Purdue for soccer camp, this was not!!!! (My granddaughter just did that.)

The group was charged with the following:

To become young people who will bring transformation

To build up the youth leaders

To stand against corruption

To be able to manage the environment through the transformation of junk (and generate some additional income)

To be able to Discover, Deploy and Develop their talents

The next Youth Camp will take place in 2028 so these TO DOs will last awhile.

I have included a picture of them after she said "YES" She, unfortunately, had to drop out of school in the fourth grade because her father left the family and her mother could not afford to send her. She works as "a seller". Please pray for this beautiful little couple that their lives together will

be blessed beyond their wildest dreams.
