The available seating of up to 44, flexible room arrangements, wheelchair accessibility, and closeup parking all combine to make this a perfect meeting place for many gatherings.

Historical Tidbits

You know Whitney Road. John Strong's wife was a Whitney. As for Edith Whitney Elementary School it is named for Edith Whitney, born in 1871. At the age of 18, she started teaching at the one-room school on the corner of Westwood Drive and Prospect Road. The building was originally on the northwest corner, but was moved to the southwest corner at some point. It is now a private residence, still standing, and is painted a pastel sage green...if you care to drive by and look at it.

Edith Whitney kept house for her father and brother, and was still living in the family farm home on Whitney Road at the time of her death in 1954. The school was dedicated in 1963.

There are some very specific guidelines which renters must follow upon signing the contract for use of the room. Renters are to clean up after the event again with specific guidelines. As a House Sitter you would be asked to be there a little prior to the start of the rental time, supervise clean up and secure the building afterward. Training is provided for all House Sitters. If you don't already have a key, one will be assigned to you. Most times renters offer you goodies to help make your job more enjoyable!!
