## Members Reports

### **October Island Tak By Christine Tureaud**

The late comers Joel and Christine showed up a little earlier to board the Island Tak on October 16<sup>th</sup> 2010. Don Udlock, Glen Bummer, Ernie Branch, Herb Mitchell, and Mike (Herbs buddy) had arrived earlier and dropped off their fishing gear. Don Udlock and Glen Bummer left for El Polo Locos delicious order of tortilla soup and chicken. Ernie Branch also left. Dennis Dickson had dinner prepared by his wife before boarding. Rich Jenkins and Paul Yazaki purchased two boxes of fresh mouth watering donuts for the trip. Mike Maurizio was the last to board.

Live squid, sardines and anchovies were our bait for the day. Mother nature provided us with calm waters and a slight mist. Steve Kelly was relentless in his pursuit of bass for his eager anglers, to no avail. We tried fishing white fish and that was even slow. Joel Tureaud caught three rays and one black soft sea urchin he yanked off the rocks because he thought he was stuck on the bottom. All were put back into the ocean alive.

Finally at mid afternoon things picked up. Barracuda chasing the bait and literally making their appearance known as they splashed all around us. White Sea Bass, White fish, and three sheepheads were quite a mix in our gunny sacks.

A 19.3lb sheephead (California Sheephead belongs to the wrasse family aka Pulcher meaning beautiful) took partial jackpot. A Newell 332 loaded up with 30# pink Ande monofilament on a dropper loop did the trick. The captain gaffed the fish and upon bringing it aboard the hook just fell out of the fishes mouth. Thank goodness the rod stayed bent in order to bring in this guy.

All sheephead are born female. Most of them change to males following environmental clues we don't fully understand. In 1990, Robert Cowen studied sheephead in four sites where the availability of food varied. In the area with the most food, females changed sex at about 13 years old and lived about 21 years. In the area with the least food, females changed sex at five to six years old and lived about nine years. At least in these two areas, the females changed sex about two-thirds of the way through their life spans.

Paul Yazaki and Mike Maurizio were the remaining calico bass winners.

The white sea bass weighed between 7 to 14lbs. Eleven were caught in all.

As we approached the dock at the end of our trip a recognizable fellow named Dick Guliani awaited the next Tak trip.

Thank you Rich Jenkins for always making sure your anglers are happy as we were.

### **SHAME ON SHIMANO!!!!!!**

In recent advertising and publications touting environmentalism, Shimano Tackle has come under attack by the National Resources Defense Council (NRDC). They are advocating the boycott of Shimano bicycle parts.

Why? Because Shimano makes fishing rods, reels, tackle and gear.

California based Shame on Shimano is on a campaign to stop the company from producing or selling fishing gear in the United States. They say they are waging a war on fishing on the West Coast. They cite the decline in fishing such as white albacore as a result of overfishing and instead of looking at commercial fishing, long lines and net fishing; have focused their attention on the recreational sports fishermen (persons). This well financed attack on a tackle manufacturer is just another wake up call to all sportspersons here in California and the United States. First fishing next hunting?

The loss of salmon fishing, a wake up call. A law that would ban all lead head jigs, wake up call. The MLPA a wake up call some people missed. The alarm is going off and some are still hitting the snooze button!

Elected officials need to hear from the people who are directly affected by these actions.

People, our sport(s) are under attack. Fishing clubs, organizations like United Anglers, and [Keepamericafishing.org](http://Keepamericafishing.org), will assist in keeping you informed of the need for action. On their site is an icon, "Take Action Now" Click on I to be updated on many issues local and national which impact our sport. By providing your email address you will be included on their action list, a site where you can download prewritten letters which you can edit and send to your officials. Sign up for updates, take action, contact your newly elected officials, no matter who they are and let them know how you feel if this issue is important to you. Sitting on the sidelines now may mean you lose your right to fish tomorrow. I hope you all voted in the recent election and will take a few moments to help save the sport by taking an active part in saving your opportunity to fish. Please take a minute of your time to Keep America Fishing!
