

2021 Clark County Virtual Junior Livestock Auction Rules and Regulations

The Clark County Junior Livestock Auction Committee is here to provide a platform for our market livestock exhibitors to sell their market animals that were purchased to show and sell at the 2021 Clark County Fair in Ridgefield, WA. This virtual auction allows our community buyers to support our future agriculture leaders as they have in the past. It is not only our goal to help the market livestock exhibitors financially, but to also give our community an opportunity to comply with 4-H, state and local guidelines to voluntarily participate in during these trying times.

How the Auction Works:

- Animals will be sold online at Breeders World Final Drive Youth Auctions to the highest bidder.
- Lots are available to view on the website starting July 20, 2021. Bidding will open on Monday, August 9, 2021 at 8:00 a.m. and will close for bidding on Thursday, August 12, 2021 at 6 p.m.
- Bids will start at the set floor price per specie.
- Sale Order will be poultry, hogs, beef, goats, sheep, rabbits. Sale order within each specie will be set lottery style.
- This auction has a soft close, which means that within the last 2 minutes of the lot, if there continues to be bidding activity on that lot, the time of close will extend by 2 minutes until all bidding activity is done with that lot.
- Bids are being placed by the head, what that means is if you place a bid for \$1,000, it is for the whole animal, not \$1,000 per pound. The auction guarantees no weights as this is not a “purchase by pound” auction.
- Bids will be fixed amounts. What does this mean? If the bid is at \$500 and your max bid is \$1,000, the computer will automatically bid you up to \$1000 as others bid against you.
- Buyers and sellers will be responsible for delivery or pick up of animal.
- All payments from buyers will be made within seven days of auction close. Invoices will be emailed within 48 hours of auction close. Credit Card payments can be made by clicking on the link on the Invoice. Payment in the form of checks can be mailed to Junior Livestock Auction, 17402 NE Delfel Road, Ridgefield, WA 98642.
- Add-On’s can be placed on the Breeders World Final Drive Youth Auction website or can be mailed in with an Add-On Form and payment to Junior Livestock Auction, 17402 NE Delfel Road, Ridgefield, WA 98642.

Sellers:

By listing your animal for sale, you agree to the following terms:

- The online auction is open to all market livestock beef, sheep, hogs, goats, rabbits and poultry. All sellers must be participants of Clark County 4-H or FFA.

- Registration is open to Sellers from Tuesday, June 15th to Sunday, June 20th. Online registration can be found on the JLA website ClarkCoJLA.org.
- The sellers of beef, sheep, swine and goats need to submit the following by email (juniorlivestockauctionccf@hotmail.com) by July 15th:
 - A video of 1 minute, or less, showing all four views of your animal set up and on the move.
 - A photo of seller and animal – make sure your animal looks their best.
 - Seller to be dressed in JLA provided T-Shirt.
 - A short bio [100-200 words] of seller and animal that includes;
 - Seller and animal name
 - Year in project
 - Hometown
 - Estimated weight – HONOR SYSTEM- Approximate weight for the day the animal was videoed.
- The sellers of poultry and rabbits need to submit the following by email (juniorlivestockauctionccf@hotmail.com):
 - By July 15th - A photo of seller (dressed in JLA provided T-Shirt).
 - By July 15th - A short bio [100-200 words] of seller and animal that includes;
 - Seller and animal name
 - Year in project
 - Hometown
 - By August 5th - A video of 1 minute, or less, showing two views of your animal
 - By August 5th - A photo of seller (dressed in JLA provided T-Shirt) and animal
- Seller will be paid once delivery of live animal has been made to buyer (or buyer's processor).
- Floor price will be per head and set by the Junior Livestock Auction Committee.
- Sellers are limited to selling two animals maximum in the online auction.
- Seller must contact buyer the day after the auction closes to determine processing on animal.
- Up to a three (3%) percent commission will be deducted from seller checks.
- Each seller must provide to the buyer the following documents:
 - WSU Extension – Market Livestock Transfer of Ownership Document
 - Cattle Only – Brand Inspection and Haul Slip

Buyers:

By bidding on an animal, you agree to the following terms:

- All winning bidders will pay in US funds.
- All seller's [parents] emails will be provided on each auction so that buyers can ask questions [bloodlines, delivery or pickup, etc.]
- Winning bidders will be contacted by seller the day after the auction closes to determine processing on animal.
- Winning bidders MUST pay the full amount within seven days of auction close.
- Splitting an animal (multiple buyers on the same lot) one buyer will bid and be responsible for the purchase. Once the auction has closed you may contact the auction committee to discuss multiple invoices for the animal.
