- *Wisdom 3:1–9 (1) No torment shall touch the souls of the just.*
- *Psalm 23 (1) "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want."*
- *Romans 5:5–11 (1) Justified by his blood, we will be saved through Christ from the wrath.*
- *John 6:37–40 (8) Everyone who believes in the Son will have eternal life.*

Over thousands of years, God's word has given comfort and hope to those who mourn. May our faith in a loving and merciful God, whom we hear portrayed in today's readings, dispel our doubts and calm our fears of death. May our faith in the Resurrection and in the redemption Jesus won for us assure us of the promise of eternal life in the kingdom.

May the faith we share and the act of sharing it with each other console us in our grief.

Pastor's Reflection

The month of November is dedicated to remembering, honoring, and praying for those who have died. November 1 is the Feast of All Saints, honoring all the saints who are with God in heaven. On November 2, we honor and pray for all those who, upon dying, experience a final healing experience that we call Purgatory. Praying for those who have died is a good and holy thing and something we are encouraged to do during this month. The reason we pray for those who have died is to lend our support as they move from this life to the next. The experience of Purgatory is God healing us with his love, and when we pray for those who have died, our loved ones know that we are with them in this momentous experience.

In the first eight days of November (Octave of All Saints) we can gain a plenary indulgence each day for the departed. The Catechism defines an indulgence in this way: "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church." (CCC 1471) Basically this means that an indulgence can help us either partially or fully move through the experience of Purgatory. The Octave of All Saints allows us to provide for a full (plenary) indulgence for someone who has died.

The Church does provide conditions, because an indulgence is not magic, but prayer. The first condition is to visit a cemetery or church on any or all of these days and offer a prayer of your choice for those who have died and a prayer for the Pope. Going to communion the day of the visit is ideal, although it can be done on another day if necessary. The same for confession. To receive the indulgence, we should be detached from sin and receive the Sacrament of Penance sometime in the days to follow. You can gain this indulgence every day of the octave (Nov.1-8), but even if you just go once during this time, you will have provided comfort and company to those who have died.

Suggested prayer:

Eternal rest grant unto them, Oh Lord

And let the perpetual light shine upon them. Amen

May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen

May they rest in peace. Amen

Prayer for the Dead, Explained!

It may seem strange to pray for someone who is already dead and who, according to our earthly reckoning of time, has already undergone judgment. But God is not subject to the constrictions of time as we understand them. Our prayers for the dead are, like our prayers for the living, an expression of charity and the unity that exists between all members of the Body of Christ.

Prayer for the dead is a practice which not only predates Catholicism but predates Jesus Christ, as we see in the Second Book of Maccabees (2 Maccabees 12:42-45).

“By virtue of the ‘communion of saints,’ the Church commends the dead to God’s mercy and offers her prayers, especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf,” says the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 1055).

The most common Catholic prayer for the dead is as follows: “Eternal rest grant unto them, o Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace.”

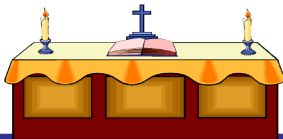
