Fire Station Furnace

Mrs. Johnson updated Council stating that Troy Messersmith filed a Petition for Review with the Supreme Court, asking them to review the case. If the Supreme Court decides not to review the case, the Appeals Court decision is final. If they do decide to review, the town will have to argue the case with the Supreme Court.

Mr. Whitman reported that a local handyman will soon submit a bid for the repairs remaining after the 2022 storm.

Mr. Thompson ordered the shed for the water pump on Center Street. He will order a roll-up door next.

Council decided to go forward with the agreement with Spokane County Regional Animal Protection

- The seal coating and chip seal project at the lagoons has been completed.
- A representative from the Transportation Improvement Board came to Rockford and made suggestions on what roads should be scrub sealed.
- The end of Third Street is still blocked by a shed and other items. Mr. Thompson would like to start building the cul-de-sac soon.
- Mr. Thompson said that he and Mr. Marcalus are close to exceeding their allowed vacation hours and asked if they could cash out the remainder.
  - Mr. Fricke made a motion to allow Mr. Thompson and Mr. Marcalus to cash out their vacation hours as needed. Mr. Whitman seconded the motion. Motion was carried.

- Mr. Fricke made a motion to approve the July Utility Adjustment Report. Mr. Stevenson seconded the motion. Motion was carried.
- Mrs. Johnson gave the Treasurer's Report, stating that the total amount of funds at the end of July was \$811,083.86.
