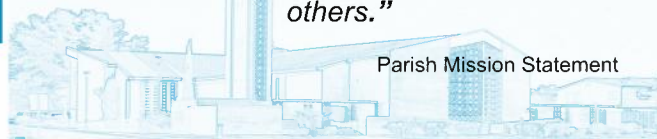

Baptisms—Baptismal arrangements must be made by the PARENTS of the child at the Parish Office. Parents and godparents *must* attend a baptismal preparation class before the baptism. Other requirements will be discussed at the initial interview.

Matrimony—Weddings are celebrated throughout the year. In accord with Church Law, at least one of the parties to be married must be a member of St. Joseph, otherwise special permissions are needed. Marriage preparation is to begin at least 6 months prior to the wedding. It is strongly recommended that a couple planning to be married at St. Joseph contact the Parish before making any contractual arrangements with a facility for their reception. During the initial interview with the priest of the Parish, the couple will be provided with all the necessary information needed for their preparation experience.

TIMES OF REFRESHING

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Healy Hall's Red Doors! People have asked me why I painted Healy Hall's doors red. I had my personal reasons, but now, I find out that my choice has been backed by history and tradition. Consider the following: Scriptural – In Exodus 12, the Lord gives specific instructions to protect His people from the dreaded “Angel of Death”. They were to smear the blood of a year old male animal as a sacrifice (v.5). Later on, it signified the sinless blood of Jesus Christ that was shed for us on the cross. Thus, His purity signifies him to be the “Lamb of God”. In verse 13, the blood is the “distinguishing mark” or an external symbol whereby God passed over those homes without destroying the firstborn within. The act was a sign of obedience and confidence that the people showed to an all-knowing God.

American - An early American tradition of a red door signifies that the home is a safe place to rest and stay. During the civil war, homes that were sanctuaries to escaped slaves had red doors.

Scottish - Scottish tradition had owners paint their doors red to signify that their mortgage had been paid off. (Hmm! St. Joseph has been debt free since 2015.)

Chinese – Red has always been a lucky color for the Chinese. They wear it during the lunar new year, birthdays and other auspicious events. In fact, they give their doors a new coat of red paint every new year. It is also an accepted element of *Feng Shui* where bold colors like red invite opportunities and abundance.

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All Saints Day and All Souls Day Masses:

November 1, 2017 - All Saints Day - It is a Holy Day of Obligation. There will be a mass at 7AM and 9AM.

November 2, 2017 - All Souls Day - It is NOT a Holy Day of Obligation. We will have the regular mass at 7AM. However, I will be celebrating a mass at All Faiths Cemetery at 8:30AM.

## TIEMPO DE REFRESCARSE

¡Las puertas rojas del Healy Hall! La gente me ha preguntado por qué pinté las puertas rojas de Healy Hall. Tenía mis razones personales, pero ahora descubro que mi elección ha estado respaldada por la historia y la tradición. Considera lo siguiente:

Bíblicamente: en Éxodo 12, el Señor da instrucciones específicas para proteger a su pueblo del temido "Ángel de la muerte". Debían untar la sangre de un animal macho de un año como sacrificio (v.5). Más tarde, significó la sangre sin pecado de Jesucristo que fue derramada por nosotros en la cruz. Por lo tanto, su pureza significa que es , El "Cordero de Dios". En el versículo 13, la sangre es la "marca distintiva" o un símbolo externo por el cual Dios pasó por encima de esas casas sin destruir a los primogénitos en su interior. El acto fue un signo de obediencia y confianza que la gente mostró a un Dios omnisciente.

En Estados Unidos: una tradición estadounidense temprana de una puerta roja significa que el hogar es un lugar seguro para descansar y permanecer. Durante la guerra civil, las casas que eran santuarios o lugares para los esclavos que escapaban, tenían puertas rojas.

Escocesa - La tradición escocesa hacía que los propietarios pintaran de rojo sus puertas para indicar que su hipoteca había sido pagada. (¡Mmm! St. Joseph ha estado libre de deudas desde 2015.)

Chino: el rojo siempre ha sido un color de suerte para los chinos. Lo usan durante el año nuevo lunar, los cumpleaños y otros eventos de buenos auspicios. De hecho, le dan a sus puertas una nueva capa de pintura roja cada año nuevo. También es un elemento aceptado del Feng Shui, donde los colores llamativos como el rojo invitan a las oportunidades y la abundancia.

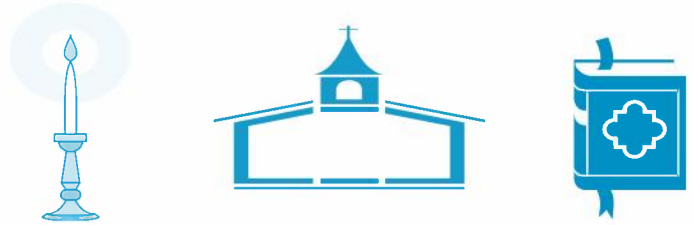
