Why the TSP Matters

Advocacy for your practice and your profession.

The Texas Society of Periodontists was founded through the foresight and vision of leaders like Drs. Charley L. Finley and L.K. Croft in 1971. Initially, the TSP served as an organization where friends and colleagues could meet to discuss the latest advances in our field.

In 1983, after a year spent serving as AAP President, Dr. Finley feared a future need for the TSP: advocacy for our specialty at the state and national level.

His fears were realized in 1999-2000 with the first attempts in the Legislature and State Board to limit our scope of practice through new rules governing intravenous (IV) sedation.

The TSP was called into action, and through the leadership and hard work of our friends and colleagues like Drs. Pat Blanton, Leonard Tibbetts, and Chuck Rader, among others, our specialty stood strong and our practices and patients were protected.

Unfortunately, 2016 saw renewed challenges not just to our scope of practice, but also to the very definition of our specialty.

Remember, the rules and laws that govern our ability to practice Periodontics with the artistry, science and skill that are the foundation of our profession are contained within the Dental Practice Act; a political, legislative document – not a professional one.

What is Happening NOW

- New rules and laws mandating inspections of offices offering outpatient conscious sedation have been proposed.
- Legal challenges to the definition and sanctity of our specialty as the premier providers of periodontal and implant care.
- The 2017 Legislative Session is upon us with many groups gearing up to push agendas detrimental to our profession an dour patients.

What the TSP is Doing for YOU

- Created an Anesthesia Committee to address proposed anesthesia rule changes.
- Board members have provided representation at TSBDE stakeholder meetings on anesthesia and advertising rules.
- The TSP hired an experienced lobbyist who has proven instrumental in helping our Society forge the necessary coalitions with fellow specialists and key legislators.
- The TSP secured representation for its members on the TSBDE's Blue Ribbon Panel on Dental Sedation/Anesthesia Safety. The Panel's creation was in no small part due to the TSP's lobbying of Sunset Commission members and working closely with other like-minded specialty groups.
- <u>BOTTOM LINE</u>: The TSP is the voice for your practice, your patients, and your profession in Austin.
