Mus 002 (1st semester)

Weeks 1-3 – Aurelia – HOME> Ear-Training Course> Level 1

This is an entry-level ear-training course. You will have three weeks to complete this course and take the test.

Weeks 4-16 – There will be one test per week assigned to finish online. You will have a week to complete each test. You may take each test three times. The highest grade of the three tries will be recorded. It is advised to take the test the first time, find your weak areas, practice those areas in the Practice section of Aurelia, and then re-take the test up to two more times.

Mus 003.004.005 - 2nd, 3rd, 4th semesters

Beginning week 2 There will be one test per week assigned to finish online. You will have a week to complete each test. You may take each test three times. The highest grade of the three tries will be recorded. It is advised to take the test the first time, find your weak areas, practice those areas in the Practice section of Aurelia, and then re-take the test up to two more times.

Any student in each section may choose to participate in an upper-level section at any point. For example, if you are enrolled as a 1st semester (002) student, you may take the corresponding test from one of the upper levels. If you choose to do so, you will not have to also take the corresponding test from your section. You will also have the choice to re-take the 1st semester test if the upper level test proves to be too challenging.

Sight-singing will be included in each class.
