CP1: *The Continental Navy in the Revolution* (Adults-Powerpoint). Outlines the birth of the Navy and early navy ships and leaders.

CP2: *The Battle of Flamborough Head*. Describes John Paul Jones' and Bonhomme Richard's victory over HMS Serapis, plus a sketch of Jones' life and other commands.

CP3: *Palmetto Fort, Palmetto Flag*. Describes the Battle of Fort Sullivan; South Carolina artillery and infantry defense of Fort Moultrie on Sullivan's Island near Charleston, S.C, against a British navy squadron and an invasion force. Traces the development of the flag of the State of South Carolina from that battle.

CP4: *Casimir Pulaski, The Man and the Ship*. Describes the Polish nobleman who became Washington's Chief of Cavalry and gave his life in the service of his new nation. Also describes USS Casimir Pulaski, SSBN633, a Cold War FBM submarine named in his honor.
