**2-DAY EHS CCP FEDERAL TRACK ADDED 1/31**

**Strengthening Business Practices for Child Care Programs** | In partnership with the Region IV Office of Head Start, the RIVHSA announces the addition of this 2-day learning track to support the organizational development and growth of our Early Head Start - Child Care Partnership (EHS-CCP). This seminar is designed for Directors, Fiscal Officers, Policy Council members, and Child Care Partners to acquire sound business practices and tools for implementing and administering child care centers and family child care homes. The training is designed to strengthen providers' foundational knowledge of sound fiscal management and business operations. The training segments are: (1) Fiscal Management, (2) Financial Reports and Internal Controls, (3) Marketing for Child Care Programs, and (4) Staff Recruitment and Retention.

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### THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 20

**Five-Year Planning for Impact** | Annual applications serve a greater purpose than requesting the next year's funding. It is the blueprint for a successful Head Start program. This session will provide grantees with an overview of the Head Start application instructions, examination of the Head Start planning process, and strategies for creating B.R.O.A.D. goals resulting in a Five-Year plan with lasting community impact.

(Full Day session – Part 1 Morning & Part 2 Afternoon) Limit of 2-3 participants per grantee. Participants are asked to commit to attend both parts for best results. Capacity limited to 50 total participants.

**All Eyes on Me: Exploring the Positive Impacts of Active Supervision** | Keeping children safe is a top priority for all early childhood education programs. Using the prominent nursery rhyme of Jack and Jill as a reflection, the trainer(s) will discuss how to implement the active supervision strategies in various contexts. Active supervision requires leadership, planning, tracking and on-going monitoring, and professional development. (90-Minute session)

**4 Community Cafés** | For the first time, ATCE offers a unique experience for staff and grantees to engage, explore and tackle RO priorities in open dialogue. Facilitated by RO staff, these sessions will provide insight, information and an opportunity for mutually beneficial discussion on top OHS and RO priorities: (1) Addressing Child Maltreatment; (2) Full Enrollment Initiative; (3) Fiscal and Facilities Management; (4) Homelessness Initiative. (90-Minute sessions)
