We were proud to offer a full and safe summer camp experience during summer 2020, where children could be seen and heard laughing and playing, swimming and learning under the watchful eye of staff and within strict safety protocols. When we were finally able to open our doors to members, staff once again did a phenomenal job of working within all safety guidelines and capacity limitations, ensuring our members returned to the Y as safely as possible.

Through it all we had the comfort of knowing our members and our community stood firmly behind us. We thank all of you who stayed with us in 2020. You share the Y's values, vision, and commitment to strengthening our community. Our goals continue to be ambitious, bold, and relevant: exceeding them will take each of us. 2020 Highlights

- In 2020 the Geneva Family YMCA hosted it's most successful Frostfest Fundraiser ever with over 800 attendees gathering to celebrate winter in our beautiful Finger Lakes region! The event raised just under \$20,000 for YMCA programs and services!
- In March of 2020 in response to the closure of local schools due to the COVID-19 pandemic the YMCA remained open to provide childcare services to essential workers as they kept our communities running.
- Our Fitness Staff responded quickly to the challenges presented by the pandemic by pivoting to offer online classes from almost day 1 of our facility shutdown. Members were able to stay connected, engaged and healthy while keeping safe at home.
- Our dedicated staff and volunteers worked tirelessly to offer opportunities for youth to participate in gymnastics, swim lessons, outdoor lacrosse and soccer adhering to all suggested safety protocols and mandates.
- Upon reopening in September of 2020 our staff successfully facilitated serving our members within the capacity and safety mandated guidelines provided by NYS. We had no cases of COVID-19 transmission at our YMCA during 2020.
- Leadership staff successfully pursued and secured many sources
 of alternative funding as well as traditional development
 opportunities within our community resulting in over \$445,000 of
 support that kept the Y operational throughout a year of
 shutdowns and drastically reduced revenue.
- The Geneva YMCA was voted Best Fitness Center in the Finger Lakes for the THIRD YEAR in a row in the Finger Lakes Times Readers Choice Awards!
