September BBQ



AGRICULTURE REPORT by Doug Sattazahn

In its July 11 Crop Progress report, the USDA confirmed strong US crop conditions as the nation enters the critical pollination and grain-filling stages.

Corn—Nationally, 74% of corn is rated good-to-excellent—the highest this season—and 18% has reached the silking stage, slightly ahead of the five-year average

Soybeans—Emerging and blooming soybeans continue on track: 66% are rated good to excellent, roughly steady week-over-week. Soybean production was slightly slashed to 4.335 billion bushels, while processing ("crush") usage rose to 2.54 billion bushels, driven by the booming biofuel market.

Market Outlook—Reuters Crop Watch suggests a possible record corn yield of 184 bushels per acre, about USDA's 181 trendline projection—but warns that heat stress in late July-August could trim potential. Concurrently, strong US corn exports (2.73 billion bushels sold as of July 3) reflect global demand, even as Brazil ramps up output.

These USDA updates reflect generally positive crop conditions, tempered by cautious adjustments in planting, production, and weather risk as the season progresses. Markets will closely watch late-season weather forecasts.

The Berks County Pomona Grange will again be manning the SOUP STAND (Vegetable and Chicken Noodle) during the Oley Fair. Fair dates are September 18, 19 and 20, 2025.

Each year the Oley Fair makes a financial contribution to the Berks County Grange for our help. Volunteers are needed from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. on Thursday and Friday and from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. on Saturday.
