Today that philanthropic effort supports 13 Shriners Children's Hospitals, 2 Ambulatory Centers, 5 clinics, 6 "Off Site" Clinics & 2 Care Centers. The two Care Centers are located in Florida with one being in Gainesville, University of Florida Medical School and Shands Hospital. This Care Center has been on or a year and in the year 2022 served over 12,000 kids. The University of Miami Medical School and Jackson Health Hospital came on board in July 2022 and already has served over 2000 kids. The type of conditions treated over the range of Shrine Services. Our advanced care is provided in a family centered environment that is focused on maximizing a child's quality of life , regardless of the families ability to pay.






