Island Tac August 4,2016 Trip #7 By Alexander Perez

The Island Tac was at the bait receiver getting some really great sardines for bait when I arrived at Channel Island Landing at 3:45 am Thursday morning. For some reason lately I've been cutting it close and my alarm clock did not go off at the time I had set it for but I made it there on time. I walked down to the dock to the receiver Ernie greeted me as I went ahead and boarded the Island Tac and found a place for my rods and tackle and went below and got a bunk. Earnie let Captain John Fuqua know that everyone was on board and it was time to go. We left exactly at 4am and headed to Santa Rosa Island the early morning weather was a little bit cold cloudy and overcast and the 2 hr ride was not that bad or bumpy. We arrived at Santa Rosa Island around 6am, our first stop was very slow and there was hardly any current, as it still was overcast as we were approximately around 150 yards from the island and for some reason the nice size sardines would not swim or last too long that was kind of strange they would swim and them stop and tire out. We did not have any luck at our first stop and then captain john moved and said we would try another spot and at this spot I was able to land the first fish which was a nice calico bass on a sardine. There were also several nice size calico bass that were eating the sardines few got on plastics the majority of the calicos were all got on sardines and some white fish were got on strips of squid. This scene went on at several other stops where barracuda, calico bass and bonita were all got on sardines no yellowtails yet had showed up. So Captain john decided to move to the other side of the Santa Rosa Island which would take approximately 45-minute drive to arrive to the spot. We were about 100 yards from the island in 70-80 ft of water as there we finally stopped and started chumming, Captain john again suggested just to flyline a sardine as there were numerous boils of yellowtail and barracuda, bonita and bass it was here at the last spot where we were able to get the yellowtails to bite which ranged from 6-10lb. Mostly everyone on board was able to catch some fish Earnie got several yellowtails, white fish & calico bass and Jose Dominguez Jr was able to land his first yellowtail he actually got 2, and calico bass, barracuda, bonita and Jose Dominguez Senior was able to get several yellowtails calico bass and barracuda ,Don Merrell lost several yellowtails ended up with 3 yellowtails, calico bass and barracuda,, Sam Zanrosso got calico bass and barracuda. Marco Dominguez got several calico bass and barracuda and bonita. Chuck Auer got yellowtail and calico bass. William Davis got several calico bass and barracuda. Glen Bummer ended up winning the Calico bass contest and Alexander Perez ended up winning the jackpot (thanks to Don he paid to put me in the jackpot as I gave it to the crew) with largest yellowtail I ended up with 4 yellowtails and 6 nice calico bass, several barracuda and bonita. I want to say thank you club member's fellow anglers It was a great trip and it was my pleasure fishing with you all. I really had a lot of fun, I look forward to again fishing with you all as were coming towards the end of the summer as I look back and think what I have accomplished in this year of fishing. I hope you all have had memorable fishing summer season, so get out there and fish life is too short you never know what you're going to catch. It might be a fish of a life time, till next time tight lines blue skies and

Yahoo for the Wahoo Eight Day Intrepid Trip By Bill Sullivan

An eight day trip on the *Intrepid* out of **Point Loma Sportfishing** delivered an epic amount of wahoo, tuna, yellowtail, and dorado. The 24 passengers were treated to the finest San Diego's long range fleet has to offer. Captain Kevin Osborne and his crew were the most enjoyable and enthusiastic group of individuals I have ever had the pleasure to be around on an extended trip.

Our trip began the week prior to the Labor Day weekend with myself, former club member Doug Townsend, and Luke Fitzpatrick's favorite fishing buddy Ben Mihm. The skipper told us we were going after wahoo and anything else would be a bonus. Well we hit the jackpot literally arriving at the Alijos Rocks alone. No other boats in sight or expected for three days. The first jig stop produced 19 wahoo and a few tuna. The group photo shot by the skipper made the cover of the September 9 edition of Western Outdoor News. We continued the assault for the rest of the day and headed for the Ridge at sunset totally exhausted.

Arriving at the Ridge with no other boats around, rested and ready to continue our quest we immediately got the wahoo going again. I was able to hook a nice fish that the deckhand said was probably a shark as he took me from the stern up to the bow and out on to the horizon. Twenty minutes later the "shark" came to deep color and the same deckhand hollered down the rail, "I need a second gaff!!" as a nice sized wahoo was stuck and carried along the rail to be deposited on the deck. This big boy turned out to be the boat jackpot winner which I gladly accepted at the conclusion of the trip. In between the wahoo were numerous yellowfin tuna from 25 – 35 pounds. All the passengers were kept busy throughout our two and a half days at the Ridge. The early morning – 3:30 am – bite found huge yellowtail and dorado attacking the stern. Jigs, dropper loops, fly lined bait, almost anything worked. An occasional wahoo even got in on the action and a few large grouper were brought aboard. Needless to say everyone slept well following our delicious and well proportioned dinner meal.

Leaving the Ridge we headed for the beach to search out a few more yellowtail spots to fill out our boat totals. We picked away at a few spots before having to put up our gear and head for the barn avoiding the wind that started to blow from the coast. The skipper said we set and eight day trip record for the number of wahoo put on board. The smile on his face was all that was needed to signify a memorable trip for all aboard. I would recommend the *Intrepid* to anyone interested in taking a trip out of San Diego.
