Biography of the 2025/6 Commander

Born 1963 in Clarksburg WV. Noble Lemasters graduated from Washington Irving High School in 1981 then joined the United States Air Force. He landed in Civil Engineering as a Protective Coating Specialist (fancy term for a painter) then cross-trained into the Electrical Career Field. He was stationed at several bases including Wright Patterson, Hickam, Nellis, RAF Lakenheath, Charleston, Malmstrom and finally Warner Robins Georgia where he retired after 26 years as the Infrastructure Superintendent at the rank of Master Sergeant. He deployed to several locations



worldwide while in CE and three RED HORSE Squadrons earning him 26 decorations, most notably the Meritorious Service Medal, Air Force Commendation Medal with 4 Oak Leaf Clusters, Air Force Achievement Medal with 6 Oak Leaf Clusters, Joint Meritorious Unit, Southwest Asia Service Medal, Korean Defense Service Medal, Kuwait Liberation Medal, Long and Short tour Ribbons and the NATO Medal.

He was raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason in 2001 and quickly excelled in his Masonic Journey to the following: Perpetual member of his Blue Lodge, Scottish Rite and Al Sihah Shrine Temple. He was Installed as Knights of the York Cross of Honor (KYCH), Knight Commander Court of Honor (KCCH) and is an active member of these prestigious groups: Red Cross of Constantine, current President of National Sojourners Chapter, Past Sovereign Master of Allied Masonic Degrees (AMD), Middle Georgia York Rite College and is the current Secretary/Recorder of Middle Georgia York Rite Bodies, AMD, KCCH and current Treasurer of the Valley of Middle Georgia Scottish Rite. He was Commander of Al Sihah Shrine Legion of Honor in 2010 and just recently installed as Commander of the South Eastern Shrine Association Legion of Honor in August 2025 and currently 1st Vice President of his Shrine Club.

Noble Lemasters's beautiful wife of 28 years, Lady Tracey J. Lemasters, has been the steady pulse of his marriage and his greatest influence. They are excited to be in the position they are in and look forward to a great year with the SESALOH.

Weird Laws

In the city of Chico, California, it is technically illegal to detonate a nuclear weapon within city limits. This peculiar law, enacted during the height of Cold War fears, was intended as a symbolic gesture against nuclear war rather than a practical statute. The ordinance imposes a hefty fine of \$500 for any



violator. However, enforcing such a law would obviously be moot in the catastrophic event of a nuclear detonation. The law reflects the anxiety of the nuclear age when small towns across the United States grappled with the looming threat of atomic war. While clearly impractical, the statute highlights how even local governments sought ways to make a statement against the escalating arms race. It remains on the books today, a quirky yet sobering reminder of an era when nuclear annihilation felt like a constant possibility.

250th Anniversaries for Army, Navy and Marine Corps

Congress established the United States Army, Navy, and Marine Corps at different times. The Continental Congress established the Continental Army, Navy, and Marines before the Revolutionary War. After the war, Congress established the current military branches.

- Continental Army: Authorized on June 14, 1775, and put under George Washington's command the next day
- Continental Navy: Voted on October 13, 1775
- Continental Marines: Established on November 10, 1775
- United States Army: Established on June 3, 1784
- United States Navy: Established on March 27, 1794
- United States Marine Corps: Established on July 11, 1798


