The November tournaments were scheduled for November the 8th on Hamilton and November 13th. a wildcard. Best producing baits were a green pumpkin trick worm on a jig head ,Carolina rig (lower left) Other baits that were successful included a darter head jig with a salt and pepper dead ringer, top water, drop shot and Alabama rig.

The top three An-

glers for the November Hamilton tournament were: Ron Knight with 135 ounces, Kirk Bixler with 130 ounces and Dave Keith with 126 ounces. On the co-angler side the top three were: Juno Jamison with 140 ounces, Paul Galfund with 94 ounces and Ernie Infusino with 88 ounces.

Big bass on the Angler side was a tie between Dave Keith and Ron Knight with 36 ounces. Big bass on the co-angler side went to Paul Galfund with 50 ounces.

The top three anglers for the November Wildcard tournament were: Don Langston with 126 ounces, Dave Keith with 118 ounces and Kirk Bixler with 112 ounces. On the co-angler side the top three were: Dan Sparrow with 71 ounces, Pete DeVries with 60 ounces and Ernie with 60 ounces.

Big bass on the Angler side went to Don Langston with 48 ounces. On the co-anger side big bass went to Norm Faustlin with 34 ounces.
