1) 8:30am: Call to Order – Gary North, Chair

a) Consent Agenda: Minutes from May Executive Committee Meeting – vote required Martin Moves to accept minutes as drafted/ Marta seconds/ Unanimously approved.

2) 8:35am: WSO Center Certification –

- a) One Stop Operator Kendall Lenhares, OMEP information only
 - (See presentation.) Certification of centers is really about accessibility and meeting standards. Accessibility can be thought of as both physical accessibility and equal access to services.
 - ii) All seven centers were certified between February and May. Each center passed although there were some gaps in accessibility which will be addressed in Technical Assistance.
 - iii) Continuous Improvement Efforts- LLT roadshows will begin in July to address the deficiencies noted in the Center Certification evaluations.
 - iv) Center Certification is where the boards and our CLEOs are empowered to make notations around partner deficiencies in complying with the WSO standards and the WIOA standards.
 - v) Executive committee would really like to see more reports back to this group via Kendall regarding the continuous improvement and the technical aspects of meeting the needs
- b) One Stop Certification Policy Jessica Fitzpatrick, Staff vote required
 - i) Jessica presented the key changes to the policy and the attachment, which included refining the deadline for recertification to every three years, expanding the accessibility assessment to include equity in addition to physical access, and to refine the documentation required for performance.

TITLE: One-Ston Cartification

PURPOSE:

Under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), local boards are required to establish criteria and procedures to assess the effectiveness, physical and programmatic accessibility, and continuous improvement of one-stop centers. The purpose of this policy is to establish these criteria, as well as the process for assessing and certifying the WorkSource Oregon (WSO) centers located within the East Cascades region.

POLICY:

- WSO centers in the East Cascades region will be formally assessed utilizing the One-Stop Assessment/Certification Checklist (Attachment A), at a minimum, of once every three years.
- EC Works staff will work in coordination with the Regional One-Stop Operator and sub-regional LLTs to conduct an on-site assessment of each center to determine if the center meets the certification requirements outlined in Attachment A.
- In the event that a comprehensive or affiliate center does not meet re-certification criteria, technical assistance and/or a corrective action plan will be documented that includes the actions to be taken and the allotted period of time to meet the conditions for certification.
- Attachment A shall be maintained, along with any referenced attachments including but limited to the Accessibility Assessment, by EC Works staff in accordance with EC Works Records Retention Policy.
- At the discretion of the EC Works Executive Director, a center may be certified/re-certified while concurrently receiving technical assistance or completing corrective action.
- At the discretion of the EC Works Executive Director, a new or enhanced center that meets the
 certification criteria may be certified at any time, following the process outlined in the One-Stop
 Certification policy.
