From the Pastor's Study

Dear Friends,

When I conducted a survey of our members to determine a meeting time for a monthly book club during the winter months, I discovered two important things:

- 1. The majority of our members who attend our weekly Bible class are not inclined to join a book club. There is nothing wrong with this as they are two very different activities and it is unreasonable to expect that every member will want to participate in everything we offer. If we are to serve a diverse, community we need to offer learning opportunities that speak to a variety of needs and interests.
- 2. A number of our members would like to participate in a book club here at St. John's, but their schedules make it very difficult for them to attend a physical meeting at the church.

To that end, Bible class will return to our weekly schedule after Easter (hopefully winter will be over by then) and we will launch an online book club in January. Since the book club will primarily include those who are unable to attend our Bible class, it will be a year-round club rather than one which meets only during the winter months. I am excited to offer this learning opportunity as a way of nurturing the discipleship of more of our members, especially those whom we are not currently serving as fully as I would like. I am excited that we already have 18 members signed up for the group! Of course, there is plenty of space available.

The book club will occur within a private group on Facebook called "St. John's Online Book Club" [pretty clever, isn't it?] You can reach the site by going to https://www.facebook.com/groups/955846788127886 and then clicking on the blue button which reads "+ Join Group." You are also encouraged to invite your friends to join us!




