MINUTES December 18, 2013

Chairman Chamberlain called the regular meeting of the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority to order at 7:36 p.m. The meeting was held at the Authority's Administration building located at 199 Foul Rift Road, Belvidere, New Jersey.

CFO'S REPORT

Mr. Houck presented the resolution and certification for adoption of the FY2014 Capital and Operating Budgets.

Mr. Scott moved to adopt Resolution #13-41, for the adoption and certification of the FY2014 Annual Operating Budget and Capital Budget/Program. Mr. Piazza seconded and the motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Mr. Houck presented the resolutions for the amendment of the Authority's Rules and Regulations and Connection Fee for FY2014.

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Mr. Niece moved to adopt Resolution #13-42, for the amendment of the Authority's Service Rules to incorporate the changes in user fees set at \$12.08 for residential and \$24.16 for industrial. Mr. Scott seconded and the motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Mr. Houck explained how the connection fee is calculated. Mr. Rosenberg asked at what point does that become such a burden as to inhibit development. Mr. Donati said that under the law the Authority is allowed to set a cap for the connection fee.

Mr. Niece moved to adopt Resolution #13-43, for approval of the FY2014 Connection Fee set at \$6,642.00 per EDU. Mr. Scott seconded and the motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

The next resolution presented relates to the audit.

Ms. Napolitani moved to adopt Resolution #13-44, authorizing the appointment of Nisivoccia & Company, LLP, to provide the professional services of auditor for FY2014. Mr. Scott seconded. There was a brief discussion about the fee. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Regarding the monthly financial analysis, the Authority is on course and Mr. Houck did not see anything alarming. Financially, we are in good shape.

Mr. Houck, Mr. Olshefski, and an engineer from CP Engineers will be attending a training seminar next year for the NJEIT Program.

Mr. Houck wished everyone Happy Holidays.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

Mr. Tipton had nothing specific to report.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

Oxford Upgrade: The Notice to Proceed was issued on December 10, 2013. The clock has started on the 245-day schedule. The preconstruction meeting was held on the ninth. The contractor is getting off to a slow start because they are trying to finish other projects. CPE is starting a paper trail in the event there are future issues related to the schedule. Otherwise, the contractor is keeping on track as far as paperwork. Based on the Notice to Proceed, Substantial Completion will be February 3, 2015 and Final Completion March 10, 2015.

Financing: The Financial Addendum forms have been submitted for the interim loan and the final loan. The closing for the interim loan is projected to be in early January 2014. Once that closing is done, the Authority can apply to recoup half the planning and design allowance.

Mr. Houck informed the Board that because an interim Debt Service payment will have to be made, the FY2014 budget would probably have to be amended before the end of that year. This

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will not cause the Authority a cash flow problem. The Board still has to decide how much they want to finance and/or take from reserve for the upgrade.

Mr. Houck left the meeting.

CP Engineers has been in contact with NJDEP to set up a meeting to adjust the compliance schedule.

The Notice to Bidders for rehab of the Axford Avenue Pump Station was advertised on November 1. Bids were opened on December 3. Seven bids were received. The apparent low bidder is DeMaio Electric Company at \$176,080. CPE reviewed the bids and everything looked good. The lowest bid was forwarded to Mr. Tipton for review; everything looked good legally. Based on the above, Mr. Donati presented a resolution for consideration to award Contract No. 13-02 to DeMaio Electric.

Mr. Rosenberg moved to adopt Resolution #13-45, awarding Contract No. 13-02 for Construction of the Axford Avenue Pump Station Rehabilitation to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, DeMaio Electric Company, at a Total Contract Price of \$176,080. Mr. Niece seconded; the motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

AUTHORITY CONSULTANT'S REPORT

Mr. Wauhop distributed his report, prior to the meeting. He reviewed the maintenance items performed in house at both plants.

Under general business, monitoring the performance of the Oxford plant continues. TDS for November was 3,703 lbs/day, well below our limit.

PEOSH Confined Space Program: Mr. Wauhop requested authorization to purchase the necessary equipment to comply with the program at a cost of \$13,518.35. The purchase will be through the Warren County Fire Academy. The coordinator, Joe Fox, has scheduled classes in January for our operators to become certified (at no cost to the Authority). PEOSH has been notified that we will be doing the above, as well as rewriting our Confined Space Policy.

Mr. Scott moved to allow Mr. Wauhop to purchase the confined space equipment as presented for a total cost of \$13,518.35. Ms. O'Connor seconded, the motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

As discussed last month, Mr. Wauhop attended a joint meeting with representatives of White Township and the town of Belvidere to discuss billing issues for flows from the line formerly known as the Hike extension. Regarding this sewer line, what lies within Belvidere belongs to Belvidere and what lies within White Township belongs to White. At the start of 2014, White Township, instead of Belvidere, will bill the resident of the single-family dwelling recently connected to the line in White Township.

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He presented a resolution and agreement for the appointment of a Risk Management Consultant for 2014. As discussed at an earlier meeting, an Insurance Committee will be formed at the February Reorganization meeting to discuss future insurance needs.

Mr. Piazza moved to adopt Resolution #13-46, for the reappointment of John Daly of Wells Fargo Insurance Services as the Authority's Risk Management Consultant for 2014. Mr. Scott seconded. The motion passed, roll call was as follows:

The bills have been reviewed and vouchers signed, as presented.

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #13-47 (Certificate No. 329: \$67,247.11) be approved to pay all bills from the Operating Fund. Mr. Niece seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #13-48 (Certificate No. 337: \$32,012.81) be approved to pay all bills from the Capital Improvements Fund. Mr. Scott seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

There was no unfinished business to report.

NEW BUSINESS

There was no new business to report.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public present.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At approximately 8:09 p.m., Mr. Rosenberg moved to enter into Executive Session for the purpose of discussing personnel. Mr. Scott seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

Mr. Rosenberg moved and Mr. Niece seconded to return to open session at approximately 8:44 p.m. All in favor, motion carried.

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Chairman Chamberlain asked for a resolution to terminate the employment of James Schnorrbusch for the reasons outlined by the Authority Consultant.

Mr. Wauhop stated there have been numerous instances of failure to perform, which are documented in his personnel file.

Mr. Niece moved and Mr. Scott seconded to terminate the employment of James Schnorrbusch. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Chairman Chamberlain requested a motion authorizing the Authority Consultant to advertise for a replacement operator.

Mr. Piazza moved and Mr. Kiszonak seconded authorizing Mr. Wauhop to advertise for a replacement operator.

Chairman Chamberlain asked Mr. Tipton on the procedure to hire a temporary replacement. After a brief discussion with Mr. Wauhop, Mr. Tipton recommended the Board make a motion and vote on the matter.

Mr. Scott moved to allow Mr. Wauhop to hire a temporary replacement. Mr. Piazza seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote. The temporary employee will be paid the same rate as when he was our summer helper.

Chairman Chamberlain asked for a motion for pay increases.

Ms. Napolitani made a motion to grant a 2% pay increase for Russell Berger, John Wasser and Patricia Kaspereen, and a 4% increase for Mike Codis. Mr. Scott seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Chairman Chamberlain wished everyone the best.

As there was no more business to come before the Authority, Mr. Kiszonak moved and Mr. Scott seconded that the meeting be adjourned. All in favor. The meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m.

AMENDING THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WARREN COUNTY (PEQUEST RIVER) MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY TO INCORPORATE ANNUAL ADJUSTMENTS TO THE AUTHORITY'S FEE AND CHARGES FOR SEWER CONNECTION AND FOR SEWER TREATMENT SERVICES AND TO PROVIDE OTHER RATE AND FEE CHANGES.

WHEREAS, the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority (the Authority) has adopted rules and regulations entitled Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority - Service Rules (Rules and Regulations) pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40:14B-1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has the right and obligation to change or amend, from time to time, its Rules and Regulations in order that they should continue to reflect the current operating requirements of the Authority; and

WHEREAS, public notice of the Authority's annual rate hearing as required pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:14B-23 was timely provided; and

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2013, the Authority conducted a public hearing on its rates and fees and is of the opinion that the proposed revision to the connection fees should be adopted, and that the Rules and Regulations should be amended to reflect the same.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority, in the County of Warren, State of New Jersey as follows:

1. A new Appendix C to the Authority's Rules and Regulations shall be included therein as follows:

APPENDIX C

WARREN COUNTY (PEQUEST RIVER) MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY SCHEDULE OF SEWAGE TREATMENT SERVICE CHARGES AND CONNECTION FEES:

1. General:

The Authority hereby sets forth the current applicable sewage treatment charges and connection fees as adopted by the Authority in accordance with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40:14B-22 and 23.

A) An additional 25% Inflow & Infiltration (I&I) factor shall be assessed on all users billed on a metered flow basis (either water use or sewer discharge), with the exception of Belvidere and Oxford whose metered flow includes system-wide I&I, in order to establish equitable allocation of system-wide I&I.

B) <u>Sewage Treatment Services FY2014</u>

Class of User

Rates

-Residential

\$12.08 per billing unit

-Industrial

\$24.16 per 1,000 gallons

C) Connection Fees FY 2014*

FY 2014 connection fee has been calculated to be and is hereby set at \$6,642.00 per equivalent dwelling unit.

* Affordable housing projects built by Public Housing Authorities and non-profit organizations will receive a reduction of 50% in connection fees, pursuant to C40:14B-22.

- 2. The foregoing amendment to the Rules and Regulations shall take effect as of December 18, 2013, the date of its adoption by a majority of the Members of the Authority, and this Resolution shall be conclusive evidence of the fact that the amendment was approved by a majority of the Members of the Authority at that time.
- 3. Except as otherwise provided herein, the Rules and Regulations of the Authority shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.
