The Reverend's Ruminations - April 2025

As we continue the rollercoaster ride that is late winter/early spring-time weather here in southern Minnesota, my prayer for you is that your Lenten faith life has not had as many highs and lows as our temperatures!?! Now fully two-thirds of the way through this important church season, have you been able to create time for some intentional self-reflection and additional prayer? Have you valiantly avoided the temptation of whatever you may have chosen to give up just a few short weeks ago? I was a couple days late in deciding to give up deep-fried foods, but since the first Sunday of Lent I have kept my fast fairly well — except for one hasty Taco John's burrito that I failed to recall includes their famously-delicious "Potato Oles" wrapped inside with the other tasty ingredients.



Midweek Lenten services didn't start out so well, when Ash Wednesday observances throughout the area succumbed to the blizzard conditions that we'd all been missing(?) the rest of the winter. It looked like we were going to have another Wednesday blizzard just two weeks later, but as so often happens, the actual weather turned out differently than forecast by the meteorologists — at least right in Fairmont. Wednesday evening services will continue April 2nd and 9th at 5:30pm



Holy Week will offer several worship activities in which to take part. Please plan to attend!

- Palm Sunday (April 13) the children will lead our joyous entry into worship, waving the traditional palms as we recall Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. The tone of the worship service will later move from celebratory to somber as we begin to unpack our Savior's passion experience that will define the latter part of the week ahead.
- After worship that day, the children will observe a version of the Last Supper as we discuss the significance of the Passover meal items and Christ's abiding presence with his disciples both then and now.
- Maundy Thursday (April 17) Tenebrae worship at 5:30pm a somber, reflective service that commemorates Christ's betrayal, suffering, and death, marked by the gradual extinguishing of candles and scripture readings, culminating in near darkness.
- Good Friday (April 18) worship service at 5:30pm an opportunity for us to contemplate the
 profound love and sacrifice of Jesus, and to reflect on the hope of redemption and salvation offered through his death.
- Easter Sunday (April 20) worship service at 10:00am resounding shouts of "He is risen!" will usher us into a joyous experience in which we proclaim the Good News from John 20:1-18 for all the world to hear. The service will include the celebration of Holy Communion as a family of faith. I invite each of you to read ahead from John's 11th 20th chapters, then gather as brothers and sisters in Christ to enjoy these familiar foundational stories of our faith "again for the first time" as we worship our great God! There will be also be an Easter egg hunt for the children immediately following worship.

The Council met in Heritage Hall at 6:00 PM. Moderator Kay Campe called the meeting to order, and Pastor Cory led in prayer. We celebrated family by sharing about ourselves.

Motion to approve the minutes from the meeting on 2/19/25 was M/S/C. (Larry Lasch/ Amanda Forstrom)

Treasurer's Report Catherine Johnson reported that the Cornerstone Fund (new name for the combined Endowment Fund and Parsonage Fund) was created. Online giving is going well. Linsey Preuss, the church's Edward Jones Advisor, will be presenting next month at Church Council. The congregation is invited. A motion to receive the treasurer's report was M/S/C. (Amanda Forstrom/Larry Lasch)

Pastor's Report: Pastor Cory talked about his many activities in the last month, including singing with Ellen in a choir with the Mankato Symphony Orchestra in St. Peter and Fairmont.

BOARD REPORTS:

Christian Education: Abby Shoen reported on the March Sunday Funday. Twenty birthday cake kits were made for the food shelter and the Little Free Pantry. In April, there will be a Last Supper and an Easter egg hunt. Empty eggs are available for members to fill by April 13th. Sunday, May 18th will be the last day of Sunday school and a bowling party for ALL members. A graduate celebration is being planned for May also.

Hospitality: Sherry Larson noted that they served 125 people at the February Free Community Meal. A calendar is being made for members to sign up for coffee/treats.

Facilities: Larry Lasch said that they have changed the clocks, covered the steam pipe by the ceiling in Heritage Hall and finished replacing the coffee room's flooring.

Diaconate: We read the minutes from their meeting.

Mission: Amanda Forstrom explained that March's Blessing Box benefits Heaven's Table. April's Blessing Box is for one of our five special offerings, Strengthen the Church. They are still looking for three groups to host Free Community Meals. They are considering making a physical Blessing Box.

Hy-Vee & Fareway Report as of Report as of 16 March 2025

Since the first of the year, \$37,881.52 (18.94%) worth of Hy-Vee slips were received. After 14 weeks, Hy-Vee is at \$70,297.16 (46.86%) toward the 18th goal which is \$200,000.

During the same time, \$11,570.17 (7.71%) worth of Fareway slips were received. After 103 weeks, Fareway is at \$112,638.89 (75.09%) toward our 5th \$150,000 goal. It could take 34 weeks to reach the 5th \$150,000 goal.

This program started the first of March 2011, so any slips from then until now can be used. Slips from 2019 were received during this period of time. Any Fairmont Fareway and Hy-Vee food store register slip can be used. Slips from Hy-Vee Fast & Fresh (Gas), Coffee Shop, Food Service, and Pharmacy help us toward the goal. Delivery slips/sheets can also be used. Thanks to all who bring/mail the slips to the Church or mail them or drop them off at my house. Even the very small amounts help.

Church Finance News

Current Financial Situation through Feb 28, 2025: Currently, we are in a good cash position because a few people have paid their full year pledge.

January-February Total Income: \$41,001.27 January-February Total Expenses: \$32,469.14

In the last 4 months, we are grateful to have received \$10,000 in special gifts toward our needs for new HVAC units. This money is set aside in our Capital/Building needs accounts.

Cornerstone Fund: With the vote of the congregation at the Annual Meeting, the Cornerstone Fund has been created. The Cornerstone Fund is the new name for the combined Endowment Fund and Parsonage Fund. Following our Constitution and Bylaws, the principle of the Cornerstone Fund is to be invested with only the earnings to be used. Each year, if there are earnings, the Church Council decides if money will be used to benefit the life and work of our church. Please talk with Pastor Cory, your financial advisor, or Catherine if you are interested in making a contribution to the Cornerstone Fund. This last year, the former Endowment Fund earnings will contribute \$3069 to work of our congregation.

Gooey Ham and Cheese Sliders

INGREDIENTS:

- 24 Hawaiian rolls or small soft butter rolls
- 24 thin slices of deli ham
- 6 pre-wrapped slices of American or cheddar cheese, break each slice into 4 pieces

For the sauce:

- 1 1/2 tablespoon Dijon mustard
- 8 tablespoon butter, melted
- l tablespoon onion salt
- 1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- Poppy seeds

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit.
- 2. Line a large baking sheet with tin foil. Line up the 24 buns in a single layer and open them.
- 3. Lay one slice of ham and a quarter of cheese inside each bun and close.
- 4. To make the sauce, combine all the ingredients except the poppy seeds in a small bowl and whisk to combine.
- 5. Pour the sauce over the top of the buns. You can use a pastry brush to even it out as needed.
- 6. Sprinkle the tops with the poppy seeds and then cover with a sheet of tin foil.
- 7. Bake 10 minutes, remove the foil, and bake 2 minutes longer. Serve warm.
