

Sunday Reflection: Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Do we pray with joy and confidence? The Jews were noted for their devotion to prayer. Formal prayer was prescribed for three set times a day. And the Rabbis had a prayer for every occasion. It was also a custom for Rabbis to teach their disciples a simple prayer they might use on a regular basis. Jesus' disciples ask him for such a prayer (Luke 11:1-4). When Jesus taught his disciples to pray, he gave them the

disciple's prayer, what we call the Our Father or Lord's Prayer. What does Jesus' prayer tell us about God and about ourselves? First, it tells us that God is both Father in being the Creator and Author of all that he has made, the first origin of everything and transcendent authority, and he is eternally Father by his relationship to his only begotten Son who, reciprocally is Son only in relation to his Father (Matthew 11:27). In the Lord Jesus Christ, we are spiritually reborn and made new, and we become the adopted children of God (John 1:12-13; 3:3).

Jesus teaches us to address God as "our Father" and to confidently ask him for the things we need to live as his sons and daughters. We can approach God our Father with confidence and boldness because Jesus Christ has opened the way to heaven for us through his atoning death and resurrection. When we ask God for help, he fortunately does not give us what we deserve. Instead, he responds with grace and mercy. He is kind and forgiving towards us and he expects us to treat our neighbor the same. Jesus' prayer includes a petition that we must ask God to forgive us in proportion as we forgive those who have wronged us (Matthew 6:14-15). God's grace frees us from every form of anger, resentment, envy, and hatred. Are we ready to forgive others as the Lord Jesus forgives us?

Saint of the Week ... Saints Mary, Martha & Lazarus

Martha, Mary, and their brother Lazarus were close friends of Jesus. He came to their home simply as a welcomed guest. The sisters felt free to call on Jesus at their brother's death, even though a return to Judea at that time seemed to spell almost certain death.

Martha's great glory is her simple and strong statement of faith in Jesus after her brother's death. "Jesus told her, 'I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him. 'Yes, Lord I have some to believe that you are the Massiah the Sen of

this?' She said to him, 'Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world'" (John 11:25-27).

No doubt Martha was an active sort of person. On one occasion, she prepares the meal for Jesus and possibly his fellow guests and forthrightly states the obvious: All hands should pitch in to help with the dinner. The Lord recognizes that Martha is "worried about many things," also noting that Mary, who has spent the preparation time at Jesus' feet listening to his words "has chosen the better part."


In 2021 Pope Francis ordered the inscription of Saints Martha, Mary and Lazarus into the General Roman Calendar, replacing the existing celebration of Saint Martha alone.

St. Martha is the patron saint of cooks, homemakers and restaurant servers. Martha, Mary and Lazarus together are the patron saints of siblings.

WIRTUS Changes to Safe Environment Compliance

Our Diocese has made some revisions to its safe environment compliance parameters which became effective July 1, 2025. These revisions allow our diocese to be better aligned with norms across the U.S.

One of the changes impacts parishes in a big way: the volunteer roles that are required to be VIRTUS compliant have been greatly reduced. The following volunteer roles are the only ones that are now included in the program: catechists, OCIC, adult altar servers, and those who minister to the homebound and nursing home residents.

Another change is the frequency that affected volunteers must renew their compliance. Background checks and awareness training (watching the video) are now required just every three years.

These changes bring our parish very close to 100% compliance. Volunteers who still need to complete one of the components will receive an
